



Administration

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- Ohio Smoke Free Workplace Enforcement Update: Through June 30, ZMCHD received 57 complaints. Of those, 38 of the complaints have been closed or dismissed with the other 19 still open pending follow-up visits to the establishments. Violations have included smoking in prohibited areas and having ashtrays present.
- The Board of Health approved a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Muskingum Valley Health Centers and PRO-Muskingum Families and Children First. The MOU continues a distinct fund to which donations can be made and from which expenses can be paid for the Community Health Center project.
- Public Health Infrastructure (PHI) Grant Epidemiology Service Contracts were approved by the Board for grant year 2007-2008.
- The PHI Recommendation to Purchase a Natural Gas Generator was approved for backup power at the Health Department in the event of an emergency.

Personal Health

- ZMCHD welcomed Joy Arnold, RN as part-time Clinic Nurse.
- The Board of Health approved the hire recommendation of Emily Fisher as Clerical Specialist.
- Service contracts for Juvenile Detention Nurse, Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Specialty Clinic, and Coshocton County Health Department Immunization Status Assessment were approved.
- The Board accepted the resignation of Dental Assistant Tina Campbell.
- Dental Clinic Coordinator Lynda Sharrer spoke to around 100 OSU dental students about public health and the clinic.

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Environmental Health

- The Board of Health approved third and final readings of Resolution 07-3-3 One Acre Minimum Building Site and Resolution 07-4-1 Amended Septage Resolution.
- Emergency Resolution 07-6-2 Adoption of Chapter 3701-29 OAC was approved to adopt current statewide sewage rules.
- An Ohio EPA Contract was approved to provide mosquito spraying at Goss Tire Dump in Brush Creek and Newton Townships.
- ZMCHD welcomed Timothy Tewksbary, RS as Public Health Sanitarian.
- The Board approved the recommendation to purchase a new Mosquito Truck.
- The ODH Summer Food Program Personal Service Contract was approved. ZMCHD will oversee sanitation and safety of the USDA program that provides free meals for kids at city parks.
- Fifteen people were trained on food safety for concession stands at the Gus Macker Basketball Tournament. Nineteen temporary food services were inspected.
- Charges have been filed against Charles Workman of Charlie's BBQ with city court for selling food without a license.
- Sanitarians presented an educational seminar to licensed pool and spa operators at the Dresden Swimming Center. The training was to increase the operators' knowledge of pool maintenance and water chemistry.
